This 2019 funding will therefore be used for four specific outcomes:

1. Development of a consistent High Quality Literacy Curriculum Plan (HQLP) incorporating
 - Research of current literature to identify aspects of a High Quality Literacy Program (HQLP)
 - Identification of effective formative, summative and diagnostic assessments of learning
 - Design a program to provide literacy instruction incorporating consistent strategies from prep to year 6, including allowances for differentiation of learning levels
 - Identify quality strategies capable of being implemented in the context of an ultra-small, one teacher environment
 - Analysis of effective literacy resources to facilitate a HQLP, both owned and required
2. Purchase of effective resources, as identified through research project, to enhance the literacy learning needs of students
3. Enhance the top 10% of current literacy students
4. Enhance Australian Curriculum: Technologies through engagement with other schools

Our initiatives include

1. Release of teaching principal to research and liaise with regional Principal Advisor Teaching and Learning (PATL), either face to face or through communication systems, to identify
 - a. Key research around key aspects of a HQLP – resulting in a literature review
 - b. Review of resources currently in the school, and how these can be used within a consistent curriculum framework
 - c. Purchase of resources (either assessment or instructional), as identified through this process to ensure the aspects of a HQLP can be consistently implemented
2. Enhancement of current literacy achievements through identified students participating in DoE's Impact Centre for reading and comprehension
3. Engaging in DOE's Small Schools Technology program to allow senior students to engage with other learners their own age
